These two laws define who can, and cannot, teach in a California Community College.

This is the official State interpretation of how faculty can, and cannot, be qualified to teach in a California Community College.

This is YCCD execution of State laws on how faculty can, and cannot, be qualified to teach in the YCCD.  
*(updated Oct-12-2016)*

This is a legally binding, bilateral agreement between YFA and YCCD which details who can, and cannot, teach in the YCCD.
