**Major premise:** Area 1 Trustee is retired faculty receiving health benefits from the YCCD.

**Minor premise:** The 2006 California Attorney General’s legal opinion states that Trustees who are retired faculty **cannot participate** in deciding on collective bargaining agreements if they involve health benefits for faculty.

**Conclusion:** The YCCD states that the Area 1 Trustee **can participate** in deciding on collective bargaining agreements even when they involve health benefits for faculty.

**Major premise:** Area 6 Trustee is married to a tenured faculty member within the YCCD.

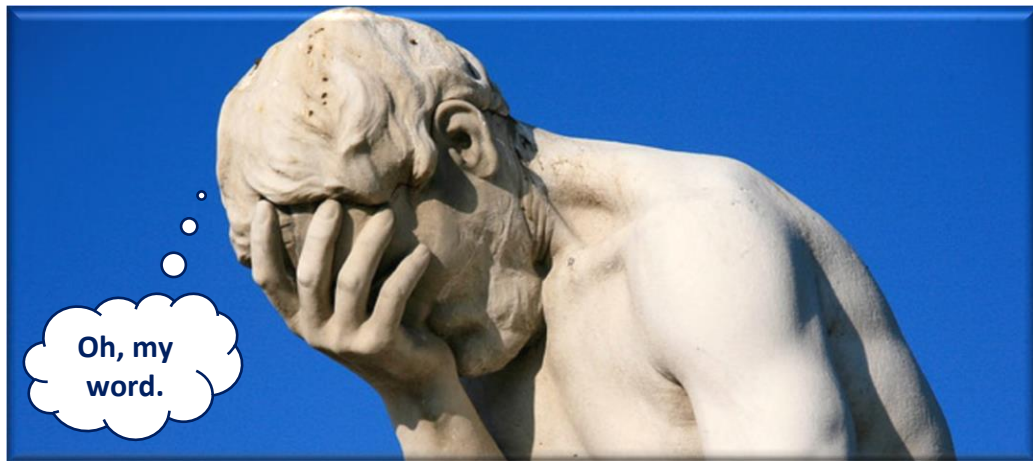
**Minor premise:** The 2014 California Attorney General’s legal opinion states that any Trustee who is married to a tenured faculty member **may participate** in deciding on collective bargaining agreements with faculty.

**Conclusion:** The YCCD states that the Area 6 Trustee **cannot participate** in deciding on collective bargaining agreements despite the California Attorney General’s legal opinion.
